

Orientation to Cave Rescue:

This Orientation to Cave Rescue provides an awareness level introduction into the dramatic and often life-critical world of cave rescue. Whether you are a caver wanting to be more prepared for the eventual injury which is bound to occur on a caving trip, or you are a member of a fire/EMS/rescue organization where you may respond to a cave rescue call, this course is hugely valuable.

When there is a caving incident, there is no ambulance or helipcopter going straight to the patient to save the day - there's only the knowledge and abilities of cavers and agency personnel, working together, to bring the patient back to the light of day and definitive care. Register now to be more prepared and capable - for others, and for you.



In-cave operations, field exercises, and classroom presentations will encompass the following topics:

Types of caving incidents
Rescue response and incident management
Cave search theory & technique
In-cave communication systems and concerns
Patient medical assessment and treatment
Patient packaging and movement
Litter movement and special challenges

This course is physically demanding with above-ground field exercises on Saturday and an in-cave mock rescue on Sunday! Gain practical experience through highly realistic training that can be applied in the real world.

No experience necessary. No requirements other than certain personal equipment.

The NCRC maintains a cadre of qualified cave rescue instructors to provide cave rescue training throughout the US. Though it is not a cave rescue team, the NCRC does track cave rescue resources and maintains equipment caches for rescues.





About the NJIRT

The <u>New Jersey Initial Response Team</u> (NJIRT) is a regional, all volunteer organization based in Sussex County, New Jersey and covering the tri-state area and beyond. The Team was organized in 1994 as a cave rescue/specialized rescue team. It provides specialized rescue resources to local Emergency Services Agencies when requested.
